*Message From Nigel*

Hello all, and welcome back to another interesting term within the Service. As you will read a number of interesting events are going on with opportunities for us all to get involved in. A couple of updates from me;

**10 Year Youth Service Strategy** – Our Strategic Priorities for the next 10 years will be presented at SLT during the next couple of months. Once these have been agreed we will publish them within our new documentation. All full time staff have been involved in the creation of these and your views on our future have been listened to during their working sessions in the clubs. These priorities will give us something to work towards for the future.

**Ardwhallan** – 2 new instructor posts have been filled and we endeavour to get them through HR and start in posts. Lots of other work going on here with some DofE expeditions happening, and training being delivered for Education Visit Leader to schools. More updates as they happen.

**Clubs** – Club numbers seem to be steadily rising, which is a good sign. We have purchased some high cost items in the hope that may attract young people to the centres. However we know that young people come to clubs as they get to see 'their youth workers' but sometimes we also have to maintain this interest, is there anything on offer in your club, if not lets work on listening to your members and providing it.

**Holiday Schemes** – I'm sure some of you will be aware of the Holiday Schemes delivered during Summer. We delivered more than previous years and added 7 schemes with packed lunches for the Holiday Activity Schemes.

**Youth Workers in Charge** - We are planning on getting 'in charges' together at least twice per year to get your views on how things are going, and what you need to ensure we are meeting parts of our priorities as a service.

**Next Generation of Youth Workers** - This is something we need to work on and how we develop and support our new staff. We have a 'Young Workforce' scheme in development and I have seen some great examples of 'grow your own' workers.

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*Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme*



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In the summer the emphasis was on the expedition section of the D of E award. Whilst the other sections of volunteering, physical and skill continued in the background, many Award Units prepared their young people for their ventures with practical training sessions on: basic first aid and emergency procedures, planning a route, hazards and risk management, use of maps and navigation, tents, expedition kit, rucksack packing, menu planning and stove use.

During the expedition season, a total of 87 expeditions were approved and saw groups out most

weekends taking part in Bronze, Silver and Gold expeditions, having to navigate around the many other local events that took place in the summer.

In anticipation of groups being out on local footpaths and tracks, some of the more regularly used routes were checked with problems reported to the Footpath Officer. Common issues were broken signs, stiles and gates which cause problems with a safe and easy passage through public rights of way.

The annual presentation of Gold Awards took place on Tuesday 26 July, at the Government House. Gold badge presentations at Royal Palaces have resumed, and many of our young people attended Buckingham Palace in May.

The summer holiday schemes were amazing and a massive thank you is sent to all staff who contributed to the schemes' success. Staff can be proud their outstanding efforts in putting on trips and activities. All your enthusiasm and hard work has created some fantastic memories for all the young people who attended. Really good feedback has been received and visits from senior DESC staff all went well.

There were 1,586 contacts across the schemes which ran at clubs in Ballasalla, Castletown, Henry Bloom Noble, Kensington Road, Kenyons, Kirk Michael, Pulrose, Ramsey, a drop-in at Café Laare and a mobile club at Willaston.

Activities and trips included pizza picnics, arts & crafts, beach days and walks, boat trips, baking, a visit to the Wildlife park, giant jenga and many, many others.

#### **LGBTQ Summer project @ Café Laare**

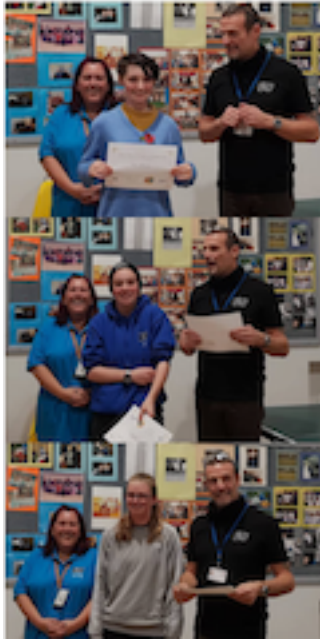
